

Loganville High School Dual Enrollment Participation Agreement

What is Dual Enrollment? Dual Enrollment provides students with the opportunity to get a head start on their college program while earning high school credit at the same time. Students who meet stated requirements are eligible to participate. Students may attempt up to 30 credit hours at the expense of the State. Students will receive high school and college credit for successfully completed courses.

Policies:

___ ___ DE courses are open to 11th and 12th grade students, 10th grade students taking an approved CTAE course at a TCSG college, and 10th grade students who have obtained a Zell Miller qualifying SAT or ACT score. All students must also meet entrance requirements to their college of choice.

___ ___ Student must apply, provide any necessary documentation and be accepted to their college of choice.

___ ___ Student must complete the DE funding application on gafutures.org every semester that they are enrolled in DE classes.

___ ___ Student must meet with their high school counselor prior to registering for DE classes to ensure credits and daily schedules are appropriate.

___ ___ Student must communicate with their college counselor to assist with registering for classes.

___ ___ Student must bring their finalized college schedule to their high school counselor.

___ ___ Students must take notice of class start dates, drop/add dates and withdrawal deadlines.

___ ___ Students are required to take 4 courses each semester, which can include a combination of traditional courses offered at LHS and DE courses. Students who are only enrolled in 4 classes will not be allowed to drop a dual enrollment course for any reason.

___ ___ Students are allowed to take more than 4 courses, but may not take more than 15 dual enrollment credit hours per semester.

Students taking over 15 credit hours will be responsible for any tuition and charges from the college.

___ ___ Students are limited to 30 attempted DE credit hours total.

___ ___ Students wishing to withdraw from an extra dual enrollment course must get approval from the college AND their high school counselor. Withdrawals after drop/add deadlines could result in a failing grade on the high school transcript.

___ ___ Students who fail 2 DE courses will be removed from the program and will not be allowed to enroll in another DE course.

___ ___ Students who withdraw from 2 DE courses will be removed from the program and will not be allowed to enroll in another DE course.

___ ___ Students may only come in late or leave early for DE classes. Students may not go back and forth between school and home. There will be a designated classroom for students staying on campus to take DE classes.

___ ___ If students are taking classes at Toccoa Falls College during the Spring semester of their senior year, any classes required for graduation must be taken in Session A.

___ ___ I understand communication about my classes and grades from my college will come directly to me as a DE student. I am responsible for reaching out to my college first when issues arise.

___ ___ I have received and reviewed my school's Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy and understand that performing poorly in DE courses could affect my ability to receive financial aid in the future.

Awarding Credit:

___ ___ All DE courses will be posted to the student's Loganville High School transcript. A Withdraw (W) or Withdraw Pass (WP) on a college transcript will not affect a student's high school transcript. A Withdraw Fail (WF) will be reflected as a 65 on the high school transcript.

___ ___ DE courses will be weighted according to the Walton County School District policy. Students receive 10 additional points for each DE course.
