What is Title I?

Harmony Elementary School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The goal of Harmony ES for the 21-22 school year is to increase the number of students reading at or above grade level and to improve student's math fluency and mathematical reasoning skills as measured by the NWEA MAP assessment.
